

Dear Rev. Fathers, Brothers and Sisters,

1. HABEMUS PAPAM: POPE LEO XIV

With hearts filled with faith and joy, we join the universal Church in welcoming His Holiness Pope Leo XIV as the new Supreme Pontiff of the Catholic Church. His election as the Vicar of Christ marks a new chapter of hope, renewal, and missionary zeal in the life of the Church. Pope Leo XIV, in his inaugural address, has called upon all people of goodwill to embrace the path of peace through dialogue, reconciliation, and compassionate service. His message resonates deeply with our call as Christians to be peacemakers in our homes, communities, and world. As the Successor of St Peter, he assumes the sacred responsibility of shepherding the faithful across the globe, guiding us with wisdom and love in these challenging times.

In a spirit of communion and solidarity with the Universal Church, let us continue to offer special prayers for our new Holy Father. Let us pray:

- That the Holy Spirit may strengthen him with courage, wisdom, and humility in his mission.
- That his pontificate may be marked by unity, justice, and renewed faith among all peoples.
- That he may be blessed with good health and deep spiritual joy as he leads the flock of Christ.

May our prayers rise like incense before the Lord, and may our Holy Father Pope Leo XIV be upheld by the grace of God and the love of His people. Let us also use this sacred moment to renew our commitment to the Gospel, to deepen our love for the Church, and to walk together in faith as a vibrant, united Diocesan family.

2. JUBILEE OF MOTHERS – 01 JUNE 2025

As we journey together in the Jubilee Year 2025, marked by deep reflection and renewal, we celebrate the Jubilee of Mothers on **01 June 2025**. This special day is dedicated to honouring all mothers, who in their silent strength and tireless service, become reflections of God's nurturing love within our families and communities. Mothers play a vital role in transmitting faith. Many of us owe our earliest knowledge of prayer and love for the Church to the devotion of our mothers. In this Jubilee, let us take time to express our profound gratitude and spiritual solidarity with all mothers—those living, those who have gone before us, and those who silently carry burdens unknown to many.

I request all parishes to hold special Eucharistic celebrations, and moments of intercessory prayer for our mothers. Let us also remember mothers who are single, widowed, struggling with health issues, or carrying emotional wounds. May this Jubilee be a time of healing, recognition, and renewal for every mother. Let us accompany them with the prayerful assurance that their role in the family is a sacred ministry.

3. WORLD COMMUNICATIONS DAY - 01 JUNE 2025

World Communications Day is celebrated each year on the Sunday before Pentecost and this year it falls on **01 June 2025**. The theme of the message of the Holy Father for the 59th World Communications Day titled, "share with gentleness the hope that is in your hearts (cf. 1 Pet 3:15-16)" draws attention to the fact that today too often communication is violent, aimed at striking and not at establishing the conditions for dialogue. It is therefore necessary to disarm communication, to cleanse it of aggression. From television talk shows to verbal wars on social networks, there is a risk that the prevailing paradigm is that of competition, opposition, and the will to dominate. For us Christians, hope is a person, and He is Christ. It is always linked

to a community project; when we speak of Christian hope we cannot disregard a community that lives the message of Jesus in such a credible way as to give a glimpse of the hope that it brings, and is capable of communicating the hope of Christ with deeds and words even today.

4. SCHOOL AND SUNDAY CATECHISM

After the summer vacation, the new academic year will commence in all schools by the time this issue of *Vox Nostra* reaches your hands. While imparting quality and disciplined education is our hallmark, providing our Catholic children with Catechism in our schools is also a serious responsibility. I exhort all Correspondents and Heads of our educational institutions to take up this responsibility seriously.

The parish priests are bound to ensure the catechetical formation of adults, young people and children. The Catechetical Commission has already organised a training program for all Coordinators of Catechetical Commission in preparation for Catechism classes this year and are given sufficient inputs on the syllabus and methodology for Catechesis. I hereby appeal to you, Rev. Parish Priests, to pay special attention to the Sunday Catechism for children which should begin on **01 June 2025** in all the parishes of our Diocese. Please catechize the Catholic parents on the importance of Catechism and their obligation to impart the same to their children.

5. ADULT CATECHISM

In addition to the catechism of children, I also urge the parish priests to organise adult catechism for the faithful either before or after Sunday masses. All families are given a copy of the Compendium of the Catechism of the Catholic Church as a jubilee gift. It would be apt if one or two questions and answers from it are taken for adult catechism every Sunday and explained to the faithful by priests in a simple yet clear language intelligible to them. You may also ask the families to go through the questions and answers before the catechesis in the parish on Sundays. Pope John Paul II states that "one of the constant concerns

whose urgency is confirmed by present day experience throughout the world, is the catechesis of adults. This is the principal form of catechesis because it is addressed to persons who have the greatest responsibility and the capacity to live the Christian message in its fully developed form" (*CT* 43).

6. JUBILEE OF STUDENTS – 08 JUNE 2025

On **08 June 2025**, we joyfully celebrate the Jubilee of Students. This special occasion is a powerful reminder that our students are not only the hope of society but also the living presence of the Church's future. As students, they are in a unique phase of formation—mentally, spiritually, and morally. Education is not merely the acquisition of knowledge; it is a sacred journey toward discovering truth, purpose, and God's will in their life.

In this Jubilee, I appeal to all students across the Diocese to reflect on how their learning can be a path to holiness. I urge parishes to organize Holy Masses, Adoration, and faith-sharing sessions to encourage students to grow not only in knowledge but in character and Christian values. In the spirit of the Jubilee, we bless all students with the strength to study diligently, live joyfully, and walk always in the light of Christ. May the Holy Spirit guide them to be witnesses of the Gospel in their classrooms, homes, and hearts.

7. JUBILEE OF THE LAY FAITHFUL – 22 JUNE 2025

On **22 June 2025**, we celebrate the Jubilee of the Lay Faithful, a profound occasion to recognize the vital role of lay faithful in the life and mission of the Church. They are not merely "helpers" in Church work; they are co-responsible for the Church's mission. Their witness in homes, workplaces, and society is where the Gospel is made visible and credible. They live out thier baptismal calling in diverse ways—as parents, professionals, catechists, volunteers, and community leaders. Their lives are the first homily the world hears.

I encourage parishes to organize and celebrate the jubilee meaningfully with masses and appropriate programs to celebrate their commitment and renew their strength. May this Jubilee renew their passion to live as salt of the earth and light of the world. I thank each of the lay faithful in the Diocese for their tireless contributions to the Diocese and pray that this celebration inspires a deeper engagement with Christ and His mission.

8. SOLEMNITY OF THE MOST SACRED HEART OF JESUS

On Friday, 27 June 2025, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. The solemnity provides us with an opportunity to renew our devotion to the Sacred Heart, the mystical-physical heart of Jesus. In addition to the feast, celebrated on the Friday of the third week after Pentecost, devotion includes acts of consecration and honour given to the image of the Sacred Heart. I exhort the parish priests to foster the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus among the faithful, especially praying the Rosary of the Sacred Heart in June.

We also celebrate this day as the World Day of Prayer for the Sanctification of Priests. Established by Saint John Paul II in 2002, this celebration occurs annually on the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. On this day, priests are encouraged to reflect on the dignity of their vocation and be renewed in their priestly commitment to serving Christ and His Church. The faithful, too, are invited to pray for their priests that they may be faithful stewards and strengthened in their service to the Gospel. Let us pray for all priests, especially those serving in our Diocese that they may experience the merciful love of Jesus through his Sacred Heart and impart the same to those entrusted to their pastoral care.

12. FABC PASTORAL LETTER

The Federation of Asian Bishops' Conferences (FABC) issued a significant Pastoral Letter titled "To the Local Churches in Asia on the Care of Creation: A Call to Ecological Conversion" on March 15, 2025. This document marks a decade since Pope Francis' encyclical Laudato Si' and aligns with the Jubilee Year of Hope. It calls the local Churches in Asia to an urgent "ecological conversion" in response to the worsening environmental crisis. It highlights the grave ecological issues affecting Asia—such as deforestation, climate change, and pollution—and emphasizes their disproportionate impact on the poor and vulnerable. The letter points to signs of hope, including community resilience, youth engagement, and growing ecological awareness in Church ministries. It urges concrete actions like sustainable living, advocacy for just climate policies, and active participation in initiatives like the Season of Creation. Ultimately, the letter frames care for creation as a spiritual and moral imperative central to Christian discipleship.
